### ARRIVAL



Welcome to the Eye Clinic of Wisconsin! Our Patient Services Representative will check you in at our front desk. They will verify your insurance, appointment information, and collect any co-pays due. You will then be guided to the main waiting room to relax while your medical team prepares for you.

### HISTORY AND REFRACTION

A medical technician will call your name

and guide you to an initial exam room. They will ask you questions about your medical history and health. They will also perform an initial vision test to determine how well you can see. The technician will then perform a refraction to provide you with your glasses prescription.\*\*

\*\*Please note: if you are seeing an Optometrist (OD), the refraction will be performed during the doctor's exam

### DILATION AND TONOMETRY



The technician will prepare your eyes for a more in-depth examination by instilling dilation drops and a mild anesthetic. They will then check the pressure of your eyes, and guide you back to the waiting room. It takes 20-30 minutes for your eyes to fully dilate, so that the doctor can most clearly observe your eye health.
